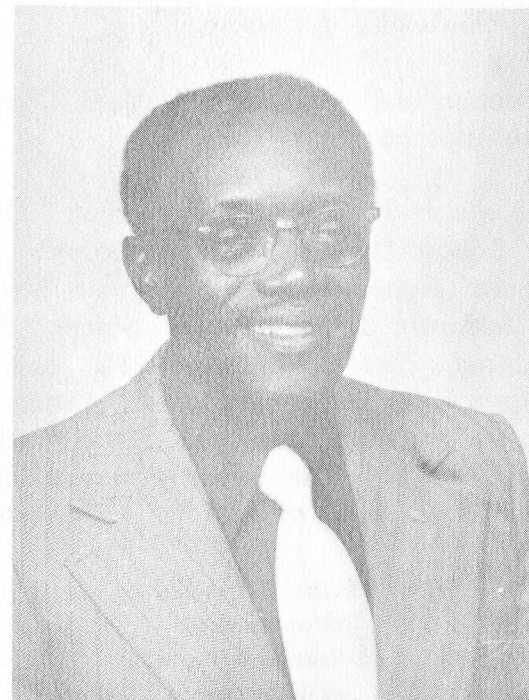
**The Twenty-third Psalm**
