Please read and hand to your Chapter Historian, immediately, giving her the name of the State Historian.

Dear Madam Chapter Historian:

May is known, this year, as "History Month." Intensive work in COMPLETING YOUR CHAPTER HISTORY, as requested nearly a year ago by the Historian General, is THE FOREMOST DUTY OF EVERY CHAPTER HISTORIAN.

Chapter Histories should be IN THE HANDS of the STATE HISTORIAN by JUNE FIRST. The outline is:

History of Chapter name

Date of organization of Chapter

Name of Organizing Regent

List of Charter Members of Chapter, with notation, showing whether each one is now a member of the Chapter. Give Chapter, State and National offices held by each Charter Member of Chapter.

Give the name of each Chapter Regent, with dates of her service.

List events under each Chapter Regency, giving a brief summary of Chapter work, and recording only outstanding events.

Give the briefest possible summary of the life history of each Chapter Regent, a Thumb-Nail Biography, modeled somewhat on "Who's Who."

BREVITY AND ACCURACY are the first requisites of excellence. This is a big National project and we need your immediate cooperation to make it a success.

It is your responsibility to send to your State Historian, at once, your Chapter History and Chapter Regents' Biographies, so that the material for your State Volume may be complete and ready for publication.
