Dear Bob Henry -

Aunt Kelly is  
sending you a sketch  
and picture of your  
uncle Felix Buchanan  
for your scrap book  
He was Major Felix G.  
Buchanan of Tennessees  
1st Tenn Regt. His war  
record was equal to any  
man in Tenn. Had more  
wounds than any who lived  
to get back home -  
He was in very little  
of importance in the  
Army of Northern Va.

Commanded the sharp  
shooters that brought  
on the battle of Gettys-  
burg. His regiment, 1<sup>st</sup> Tenn  
Archers Brigade.

Occupied the center of  
the line in Pickett's

famous charge, going  
up Cemetery ridge -

He commanded the  
brigade of 4000 men -  
Remnant, of 8 Tenn

regiments, that had  
gone into the battle -  
which covered the retreat  
from Gettysburg. There

has been published  
a thrilling account of  
a hard to hard conflict  
these men had with

a body of men  
 army, which saved  
 the bridge across  
 the Potomac river, over  
 which Lee's army had  
 to cross - I had the  
 account of it in my  
 scrap book written by  
 an eye witness - He  
 had no any experience  
 after this - and surrendered  
 at Appomattox  
 Had never seen his  
 father, and mother since  
 April 1861 - He was at  
 Henry & Emory College  
 in Pa. until the year  
 before the war - was 22  
 years old, when this picture  
 was taken - Second year  
 of the war

never say I have given  
Bob Henry a his copy of  
the War I thought it  
might be of interest to  
him when he was on  
old man. But it is his  
ser of books - you can  
down here it on the other  
side. and take off of this  
paper - I put it on to one  
it - I am sending you a  
little box of pictures  
of some of our family -  
I have been working on my
