Mr. Ellis Melvin Griffis, son of the late Earl and Memory Griffis, was born in Athens, Alabama on October 14, 1921. He graduated from Trinity High School (Athens) in May 1941. He attended LeMoyne College in Memphis, Tennessee and Alabama A&M University in Normal, Alabama.

He earned three medals while serving four years in World II.

He retired from Gunitite Foundries in Rockford, Illinois after being employed from 30 years. He was a longtime member of the National American Legion Local Chapter in Rockford, Illinois. During his youth, he joined with Village View United Methodist Church under the Pastorage of the Rev. L. G. Fields. He always spoke fondly of Village View as his home church and found his way back to visit whenever he came home. Three years ago he returned to Athens but he was unable to attend as he desired due to health problems.
